6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

• Curricular design is drafted by Board of Studies which is a statuary body of R. T. M. Nagpur University. It is compulsory to follow the prescribed syllabus prepared by Board of studies.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- Academic calendar of the college is prepared at beginning of the session.
- Faculties of all subjects prepare and implement their own teaching plans.
- Faculty maintains abstracts and daily diaries of teaching. It helps to monitor regular teaching learning process.
- Two unit tests are conducted in the first as well as second session respectively.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- The faculty informs students about changes in syllabi and pattern of question paper from time to time.
- The university evaluates students by conducting annual examination. The question paper pattern for B. A. and B. Com. is theoretical. There are internal assignments only for the optional subjects i.e. Marketing and Information Technology in Commerce faculty.
- The college is a recognized University examination centre.
- The college conducts two unit tests in the first as well as second session respectively. Annual test examination is also conducted after the completion of the syllabus.
- Spot valuation conducted by the university is transparent. If a student is not satisfied with evaluation, he can apply for revaluation through the college and can also demand Photostat copy of the concerned answer sheet.

6.3.4 Research and Development

- The institution always encourages and promotes faculty participation in research.
 The institution has purchased good volumes of reference books from UGC
 Grants. Twelve research journals have been subscribed. The institution has also
 enlisted itself for N-LIST Account under INFLIBNET. Internet facility for the
 faculty is available under UGC Network Resource Centre.
- One of the faculty Shri D. D. Khadagi (Deptt. Of Marathi) has completed a minor research project in Department of Marathi.

6.3. 5 Library, ICT and physical Infrastructure/Instrumentation

Library: Physical Infrastructure

Total area of the library is 616 sq. Ft. The reading room can accommodate 20 students at a time. There is open access system for faculty. The reading room remains open from 7.30 a. M. to 2.30 p.m. on all working days and during vacation also. There is sufficient number of steel stacks for keeping all books. The library has an advisory committee for smooth functioning.

Details of ICT and other tools

- Lib-man software has been installed in the library.
- The library has four computers with VPN Internet facility.
- The library has subscribed N-list account through INFLIBNET. Students and faculty can get print outs of required data.

Specialized Services

- Xeroxing facility is available for students and faculty.
- Lists of newly purchased books and cover jackets are displayed on notice board in library.
- An exhibition of newly purchased books and other study materials is arranged every year. It creates awareness about the importance of books among the students.

Support Facilities in the Library

- The students of environmental science and Population Education Programme can have newspaper cuttings for preparing project reports.
- Book bank facility is available for students. They can borrow books from library during examination time also.
- Library staff is cooperative and ready to help students and teachers.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- The responsibility of carrying out curricular and co-curricular activities is entrusted to various committees. These committees are formed in staff council meeting at beginning of the session.
- The teachers are encouraged to participate in refresher, orientation and short-term courses. They are also encouraged to attend conferences and symposia.
- It is seen that their placements are done on time under Career Advancement Scheme of UGC.
- Non-teaching staff is encouraged to attend training workshops.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

- Recruitment in the college for all posts is made as per UGC and State Govt. norms.
- At present, there are three Associate Professors and nine Assistant Professors.
- There are seven non-teaching employees.
- One post in teaching and one post in non-teaching staff—is vacant.
- Process of filling up these posts is going on.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

• The college has not so far collaborated with any industry.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

- The prospectus of the college is published every year at the beginning of the session. It ensures wide publicity of the admission process.
- Our college is located in rural area and it runs traditional courses viz., B. A. and B. Com. The nature of admission process is not competitive. Hence, we have adopted first-cum first-serve policy to ensure transparency in the process.
- An admission committee is set up at the beginning of the session.
- Two teachers each from Arts as well as Commerce faculty are included in this committee.
- They verify the documents submitted by the students and assess their aptitude and inclination.
- The teacher guides in selecting proper optional subjects.
