6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

• Curricular design is drafted by Board of Studies which is a statuary body of R. T. M. Nagpur University. It is compulsory to follow the prescribed syllabus prepared by Board of studies.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- Academic calendar of the college is prepared at beginning of the session.
- Faculty of all subjects prepare and implement their teaching plans.
- Faculty maintains abstracts and daily diaries of teaching. It helps to monitor regular teaching learning process.
- The teachers use participatory methods consisting class room seminar, group discussion, chart preparation, etc.
- Department of Economics has used E-content in teaching –learning process.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- The college is a recognized University examination centre.
- The college conducts two unit tests in the first as well as second session respectively.
- The University conducts theory examination of all faculties as per semester system. The responsibility of conducting internal assessment is carried out by concerned subject teachers. The teachers make internal assessment on the basis of Students' Profile.

6.3.4 Research and Development

- The institution always encourages and promotes faculty participation in research.
 The faculty can avail duty leave to attend conferences/seminars/symposia.
 Travelling allowance for that purpose as per UGC guidelines is also granted to the faculty.
- The institution has purchased good number of reference books from UGC Grants. Research journals have been subscribed.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical Infrastructure/Instrumentation

Library: Physical Infrastructure

The total area of the library is 616 sq. Ft. The reading room can accommodate 20 students at a time. There is open access for faculty. The reading room remains open from 7.30 a. m. to 2.30 p.m. on all working days and during vacation also. There is sufficient number of steel stacks for keeping books. The library has an advisory committee to look after smooth functioning of the library.

Details of ICT and other tools

- Lib-man software has been installed in the library for automation. It helps for computerized accession of books.
- The library has six computers with Broadband Internet facility.

Specialized Services

- Xeroxing facility is available for students and faculties.
- Lists of newly purchased books and cover jackets are displayed on notice board in library.
- An exhibition of newly purchased books and other study materials is arranged every year. It creates awareness about the importance of books among the students.

Support Facilities in the Library

- The students of environmental science and extension activities can have newspaper cuttings for preparing project reports.
- Book bank facility is available for students. They can borrow books from library during examination time also.
- Library staff is cooperative and ready to help students and teachers.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- The responsibility of carrying out curricular and co-curricular activities is entrusted to various committees. These committees are formed in staff council meeting at beginning of the session.
- The teachers are encouraged to participate in refresher, orientation and short-term courses. They are also encouraged to attend conferences and symposia.
- It is seen that their placements are done on time under Career Advancement Scheme of UGC.
- Non-teaching staff is encouraged to attend training workshops.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

- Recruitment in the college for all posts is made as per UGC and State Govt. norms.
- At present, there are four Associate Professors and six Assistant Professors.
- There are seven non-teaching employees.
- One post in teaching and one post in non-teaching staff—is vacant.
- Process of filling up vacant posts is going on.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

• The college has not so far collaborated with any industry.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

- The prospectus of the college is published every year at the beginning of the session. It ensures wide publicity of the admission process.



Observations:

- 1. Table 1.2 shows that 51 students expressed that the knowledge of the teacher is very good.
- 2. Around 40 students responded that teachers are sincere, accessible and having communication skill in classroom activity.
- 3. One -third of students responded that teachers are able to generate interest and to integrate course material for students.
- 4. One -third of students responded that teacher are applying to participatory teaching methods in teaching —learning process.
- 5. 38 students have expressed that teachers are available for discussion in the college premises.

Suggestions:

- 1. The teachers should intensively apply participatory methods in teaching-learning process.
- 2. The teachers should more apply communicative skills as it would be for students progression.
- 3. The teachers should adopt ICT based practices in teaching learning process.
